RULINGS OF CONVENTION.

1. Resolved that a girl cannot be considered a member of the national body—Mu Phi Epsilon—until her name be enrolled on the Supreme Secretary's book; and that this cannot be done until she has her certificate.

2. Resolved that the card catalog be attended to by the Supreme Secretary and that in case of change of name or address due notice of same be sent to the Supreme Secretary.

3. Resolved that the names of the President, Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer be sent to each member of the Supreme Council immediately after elections in the several chapters.

4. Resolved that the name—Piano, Violin, or Voice—precede the name of the selection on convention concert programs.

5. Resolved that all financial obligations of all chapters be sent to the Supreme Treasurer at least ten days before the convention.

6. Resolved that the sorority badge be the property of the sorority and is to be worn only by members in good standing.

7. Resolved that the sorority badge be draped by placing a black ribbon from right to left diagonally across it.

8. Resolved that a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars be imposed upon a chapter not represented at a convention.

9. Resolved that hereafter each new member will receive a printed constitution with her certificate.
