Rulings of Convention

1911

1. *Resolved*—Committee on Credentials and Secret Signs meet before formal opening of Convention.
2. *Resolved*—Reports of Chapters be read immediately following reports of Supreme Officers.
3. *Resolved*—Excuses for absent member in Chapter order of business be called for after roll-call.
4. *Resolved*—Annual tax be \$1.50—this to include a year book. (Total sent to Supreme Treasurer, \$2.50.)
5. *Resolved*—All money to be sent direct to the Supreme Treasurer.
6. *Resolved*—Supreme Treasurer give bond for \$500 through a bonding company.
7. *Resolved*—It be the duty of Supreme Secretary to place Mu Phi Epsilon in World's Almanac and the Sorority hand books.
8. *Resolved*—Candidate for office of Supreme President be a former council member.
9. *Resolved*—We have a ceremony for Honorary members.
10. *Resolved*—We have a new pledge ceremony.
11. *Resolved*—Constitutions be sent to chapters at beginning of year.
12. *Resolved*—Tenure of office in Supreme Council be limited to two successive terms.
13. *Resolved*—Honorary members be chosen from international celebrities.
14. *Resolved*—Year Books be sent to all eligible schools.
15. *Resolved*—Schools voted on must be installed within one year or voted on again.
16. *Resolved*—Cover of year book be purple with coat of arms in lower left hand corner.
17. *Resolved*—Chapters have a regulation size picture.

Rules for Convention Delegates

Note—All delegates are requested to carry out these rules in every detail, to avoid delay to the Historian.)

Each chapter should be represented at the National Convention by two delegates, one musical and one business delegate.

Each delegate should carry with her, her credentials which must be signed by Chapter officers.

The musical delegate is to give one number on the musical program.

The business delegate is to bring material for the Year Book. That includes:

1. Annual letter, giving chapter officers and news of the past year, together with any personal notes of interest.
2. Alphabetically arranged lists of the names of all members, active, alumnae and honorary, and their addresses, school and home addresses. (The names of all married members should be followed by the husband's name in parenthesis, i. e. "Mary Smith (Mrs. B. F. Jones)"). (All material must be typewritten on one side of paper only and each new heading on a new sheet of paper.)
3. Picture of chapter members or preferably a cut—proportions $6\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$.
4. Fifteen dollars' worth of advertisements at least, or \$7.50 in money.
