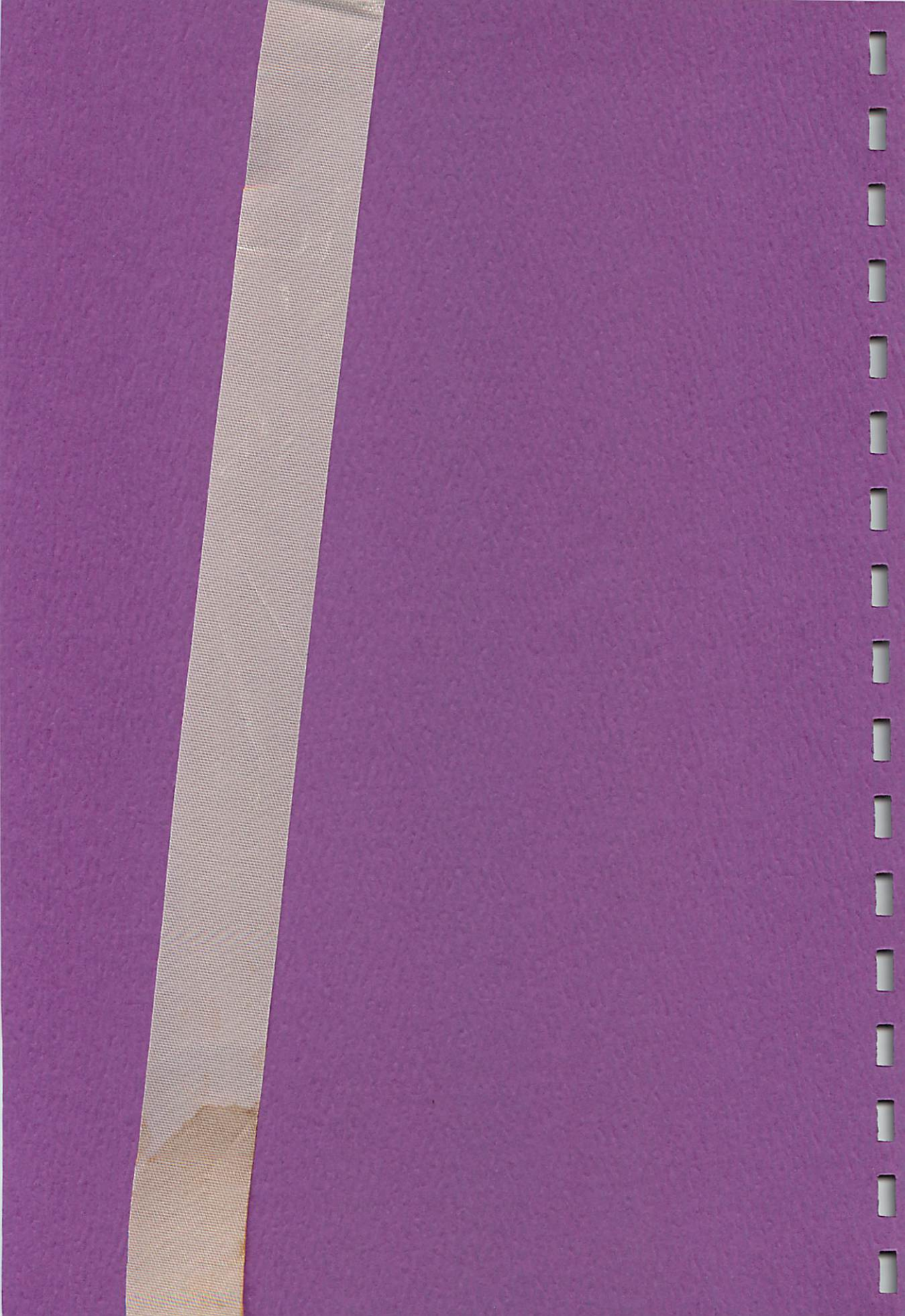

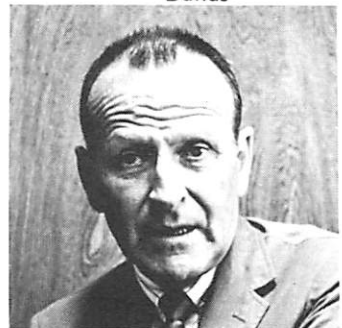

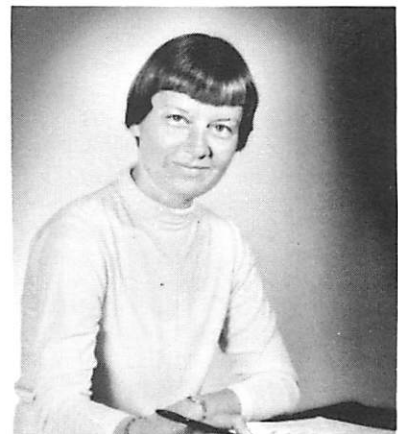


EMMA LOU DIEMER

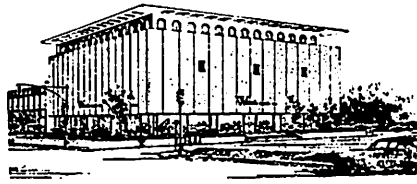

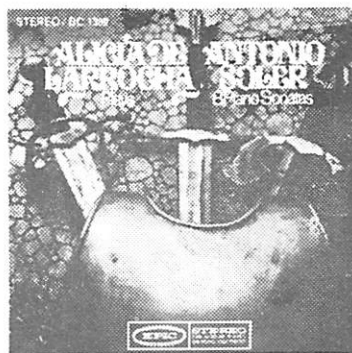
