



PAUL CRESTON

One of the most widely performed of the American composers today was born in New York City. A piano and organ student from childhood,he is self-taught in harmony, counterpoint, orchestration and composition. He has composed over eighty major works and has won numerous awards and citations. For the next year, 1968–1969, Mr. Creston has been appointed Professor of Music and composer-inresidence at Central Washington State College. He is an honorary member of the board of Mu Phi Epsilon Memorial Foundation. His work, "None Lives Forever," was commissioned for and will receive its premiere at this convention.



MARY SNOW McCARTY

Holds a Bachelor Degree in composition from Indiana University and a master's in composition from University of Illinois. She has taught piano at the University of Illinois, and presently is teaching piano and composition at Texas Technological College. Her current enthusiasm is composition combining taped electronically manipulated instrumental sound with live performance. Recently her article on the subject "Old and New Sounds for the Young Composer" was published in the magazine of the Texas Music Teachers Association. Phi Tau initiate.





ROBERT ANDERSON

One of America's foremost young organists, received his early musical education at the American Conservatory, Chicago. He earned a Bachelor of Sacred Music degree from Illinois Wesleyan University and Master's of Sacred Music from Union Theological Seminary. The recipient of a Fulbright grant, he went to Frankfurt, Germany to study and expand his repertoire. In 1959 he made a recital tour of Germany and returned to America to complete doctoral studies at Union Seminary. He was appointed to the faculty of S.M.U. in Dallas where he serves as head of the Organ Department and University Chapel Organist.



DOROTHY BRIN CROCKER

Registered Music Therapist and former president of The National Association for Music Therapy. 




